5. Details of Enforceable Undertaking	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The educator will advise the Regulatory Authority of: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. the educator's current employment details including the name, location and contact details of the educator's employer and the role held by the educator. b. any changes to the educator's employment details within 72 hours of the change. c. any changes to the educator's contact information including residential address, postal address, email address and phone number within 72 hours of the change. 2. The educator will abstain from using illicit drugs. 3. The educator will submit to random drug tests with a pathology laboratory, at the Regulatory Authority's direction, for a period of six (6) consecutive months. These drug tests will be conducted at the educator's own expense. 4. The educator will submit the drug test results to the Regulatory Authority via email within 72 hours of the Regulatory Authority's direction to take a drug test. 5. The educator will submit the original drug test results within seven (7) days of the Regulatory Authority's direction to take a drug test via post to the Regulatory Authority.
6. Steps taken	The educator has agreed to the details of the Enforceable
